

Week 5: Jesus and Abraham

After spending the month of January thinking about Jesus before the world began, and his role in the creation of that world, Danny Petrillo takes us through the life of Abraham and looks for connections to the life of Christ there. It is an interesting approach to consider that Jesus did far more on this earth than his 3 year ministry before dying on the cross, and we will benefit greatly from the study.

One thing this approach provides for us is continuity. We still struggle most of the time with a view of the Old and New Testaments that is segregated and compartmentalized. We tend to think the

Old Testament was the 'rough draft', meant for the Jews, and then it was replaced by the new covenant through Jesus. I'm afraid this overly-simplistic separation hurts us more than it helps, because God is the same yesterday, today, and forever. To just dismiss the Old Testament out of hand because its laws are not binding on us today means losing out on the riches of God's grace in the messy lives of real people, struggling to figure out how to live. Jesus has significance in this reality, and studying it in this way is invaluable.

Read about it in our devotional book this week, and you'll be blessed!
